The Lost Men

I have started reading a book on essentially Ernest Shackleton's support party, with a short history of contest and personality, the story progresses to the story of a team that was to lay provisions for the main party which was attempting the first crossing of Antarctica. I find that many details of financing, getting the correct team and the right mindset as well as the reason for the attempt are all equally important in telling the tale and insightful for our less ambitious endeavors. Much has been written about Shackleton and he is a heroic figure but I have found that in this tale he is not lionized and put on a pedestal but with his shortcomings and that force of environment all rose to meet the necessity of survival. The support team knew that they were the only means of survival and that one dynamic reason drove men beyond their own survival, beyond to the survival of others. I have yet to finish this story but being drawn from journals and personal histories the author Kelly Tyler-Lewis gives us more to draw on than just accomplishing the goal, but being better, not giving in, surviving for others. As a modern reader this also gives insight to the changes in planning, gear, travel, transport, food and scope of what is called the "last odyssey of the heroic age of Antarctic exploration".......I recommend it.......published in 2007, it is probably at your local library to lend.....
