Yeah, But We Went Anyway



Rafting on the New River

Memorial Day weekend 1995 will find SOLAR headed to West Virginia for white-water rafting on the New River with ACE Rafting Company.

The cost of the trip is \$140 and includes one day of rafting with an expert guide in each boat, several meals: 2 breakfasts, 2 dinners, and 1 funch, and three days worth of camping. And since this is a Jim Gilfix trip, you'll get your very own Vernors! If you prefer to "rough it" on the river, but not in the campground, some space may be available in the chalet for \$170 for the weekend. The Chalet will only be available if six people sign up for it. There are 3 double beds and you are not allowed to cook inside.

Other opportunities for SOLAR style entertainment in the area include mountain biking (including rentals if reeded), volleyball, bass fishing (right at the campground!) and a

semi-organized hiking trip on the rock infested, waterfall encumbered, and cave encrusted trails in the area. ACE has their own 1300 acre resort/outdoor center.

Bird Migration at Point Pelee

Point Pelee National Park in Lemington, Ontario. Canada is known as one of the best locations in North America to observe the northward migration of birds.

The total number of bird species recorded at Point Pelee is 347, of which 328 species have been recorded for the spring migration period. May is the month dear to the hearts of most birders, since it is possible to see more species at the height of migration than at any other time of year. For the past few years, SOLAR members have gone to Point Pelee to experience this event by spending a day at the park.

This year, SOLAR is among the privileged few to have a campsite at the park during the peak of the spring bird migration. The advantage of camping at the park (for those hard-core birders) is crawling out of your tent at the crack of dawn and jumping right on the trail to spot those "early birds" before the day crowd of bird watchers hits.
