TIP OF THE MONTH

Remember that test manufacturers state that open flame should not be used near the tent, due to flammability of the tent material. Cooking in tent vestibules in inclement weather is common, although extreme caution should be used (don't forget ventilation!). Also remember that cooking odors may get imbedded into the tent fabric, making your tent a 'dinner' for rodents, raccoons, and perhaps even bears! Think, and he aware of your options when cooking near tents.

POINT PELEE BUTTERFLIES AND BIRDS

For a few special days each autumn, Point Pelee becomes a magical kingdom for migrating monarch butterflics and winged creatures heading south. The sky fills wih hawks, bluejays and birds of every sort.

We will be careful but you should outfit yourself with a towstrap, winch, or come-along, to pull yourself or a friend out. We will try to avoid anything too scary. (What fun is that?-editor.) The campground is about 500 yards from a road, where we can spot a car for those of us that don't really want to carry a full backpack. The campground is a walk-in only camp, and parking on the road is very limited. I will be setting up camp on Friday the 16th in the evening. If anyone would like to join me Friday, or drop off their gear early Saturday before our 8AM meeting time, feel free.

There is a water pump and an outhouse in the campground (almost like Club Med!). There is no water available at the trailhead, so be sure to bring your own for the hike in.

The Jordan River Pathway is very hilly and very beautiful. The colors at this time of the year should be spectacular! Bring your cameras, remember the SOLAR Photo Contest is in January. The cost is \$10 for this event, which includes camping and Sunday breakfast.

HARBOR SPRINGS BIKE TOUR

Joan Westbrook is coordinating a bike tour on the weekend of September 25-27th.

The tour begins at the *Petoskey KOA* and loops near state forest land. The tour continues along Lake Michigan and ends up at *Harbor Springs*, 54 miles later.

If you don't feel that you can ride for this distance, there will be the availability of shorter distances. There will also be SAG support for those that may have to 'bail out' or need assistance along the tour.

The tour will be on Saturday and you can expect to it to take 4-6 hours, depending on your pace. Lunch will be your own responsibility.

As far as equipment needed for the tour, you must wear a bike helmet, which is **manditory**. Water bottles, wind shell clothing, energy bars, and a spare tube is recommended.

There will be no need to carry camping gear or car spotting.

Camping is limited to one tent per site. The pool will be closed, but the showers will be available.

Sunday options include:

- · Biking the VASA Trail near Traverse City
- · Visiting Mission Winery on the peninsula
- Mountain Biking in Wilderness State Park
- Harbor Springs Marina and shops
- Thornswift Nature Preserve on M-119

The cost is \$30 which includes SAG support and camping fees.

AUTUMN INDIANA ADVENTURE

Jim Gilfix is doing it again! First in 1994, then again in 1996. It's the Gilfix "Color tour, canoe trip, bird watching, pienicing, camping, Shipshawanna, doeverything in Indiana" event.

This event is at the *Chain-O-Lakes State Park*, located northwest of Fort Wayne, Indiana. This is about a 3 hour drive from the Detroit area.

There are nine interconnected takes flanked by wooded hill sides. Since this is near peak color season, be sure to bring your camera on the canoe (another plug... don't forget the photo contest in January!- ed.). The canoes will be rented for 4-3 hours per day, so you will have plenty of time to capture some wildlife on film, such as Blue Herons, deer, mink, beaver, racoons, and various song birds.

The campsites are modern, adding to a relaxing weekend. Day hikes are on the agenda, along with picnicing. And don't forget the famous SOLAR pot-luck dinner on Saturday night. If you wish to visit Shipshawanna or the flea market, Jim recommends you do that on Friday.

Since this is a non-SOLAR event the cost is entirely up to you. The campground charge is \$12 for two nights/per site. You will pay this directly to the campground when you get there. Cabins can also be rented in the park. Call the park directly for current charges, and to reserve one. The park's number is (219) 636–2654.

Canoeing requires a \$20 deposit and has a fee of \$2.507 hour. All charges are paid directly to the park.

The attendees at the last two trips were impressed by the pleturesque waterway, and so you will too!

Monster's Favorite Cookie!

2 cups butter

4 cups flour

2 tsp bakirg soda

2 cups sugar

5 cups blended oatmeal

24 oz chocolate chips

2 cups brown sugar

1 tep salt

1 bar 8 oz Hershey Chocolate Bar (grated)

4 la eggs

2 tep baking powder

3 cups chopped nuts (any type)

2 tep vanilla

Measure oatmeal and blend in a blender to a fine powder. Cream butter and both sugars. Add eggs and vanilla; mix with floor, patmeal, salt, baking powder, and taking sodal Add chocolate chips, Hershey Bar and nuts. Roll into balls and place two Inches apart on a cookie sheet. Bake for ten minutes at 375 degrees. Makes 112 cookies.
