SOLAR Year 2000 Rockclimbing Class



Have you ever wanted to try rockclimbing? Do you want to get outside and climb on real rock rather than plastic?

Have you climbed before and want to learn how to hit the croqs on your own?

Then SOLAR's Rockelimbing class is for you

In the course of a few weeks, you will:

- Gain the knowledge of how to safely configure a top-roping setup using natural anchors.
- Learn two basic knots commonly used in climbing (more if time pennits).
- Safely belay other climbers using a top-rope setup.
- Earn the ability to use dub rockelimbing gear at SOLAR-sponsored outings.
- Be provided with the skills required to safely set up a climbing system, climb on it and break it down at the end of a fun-filled day!

The cost is \$80 and includes a coursepack, book, camping fees, gear and practice tope. The dates are: April 10, 17, 24, and May 1 at REI. A mini-practical is on April 29 at Planet Rock. The final practical is May 5-7 at Rattlesnake Provincial Park.

Point Pelee—In Search of Piranga ludoviciana

Head on over to Point Pelee, just outside of Learnington, Ontario, and join us for a dayhike! We plan on getting to the park at sunrise to hear the full symphony of bird song and calls and to see the birds in full swing. There are several different areas to explore and consequently, different birds to watch for. The Point features water birds and hawks, the woodlands feature songbirds, especially warblers, and last year, the combination of red-winged blackbirds and marling reeds in the enormous marsh was totally euphonious. We have booked an expert birder to take 20 people (strict limit) on a nature walk starting at 8:45 am. The cost for the tour is \$5 per person. For those who have already signed up, please contact Amy or John Fedyk if you want to join us on the guided walk—and get your money in ASAP. You must pay the 5 bucks to reserve your spot so first pay, first go. Bring your binoculars so you can see the fabulous variety of birds up close. . Jim Gilfix is running two whitewater rafting trips in West Virginia on the Upper and Lower New Rivers on Memorial Day weekend. One trip is for ages 14adult and involves some intense rapids; the other trip is class 1-2 rapids and perfect for the kids. The cost is \$135 for the first trip and \$125 for the second (kids are \$70). Group comping is available for \$30/adult and \$15/child for three nights. MAP SKILL AND ARMCHAIR ORIENTEERING CLASS, 4/8 ~ 4/9.

This class will be held on Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning at the Waterloo Recteation Area. It will start immediately after the Land Navigation Class on Saturday. Tentative topics include resection, declination, modifying a map so it can be used with a baseplate compass or a GPS, basic night compass, and orienteering techniques. Participants can then practice their orienteering skill in a local meet on Sunday afternoon. The cost is \$5 (cheap, but it is quality cheap), and all participants must know the basics of map and compass before coming to class. However, this class is FREE (another SOLAR perk?) if you are attending the Land Navigation Class, but you should still sign up for this class if you plan on coming. Coastal Kayaking

July 7-9, 2000,

ACA Cosatel Kayaking Instructors will conduct the American Canoe Association's Fundamentals of Cosstal Kayaking 16 hour course. The course, which is designed for endousiastic beginners and intermediate paddlets, will cover basic strokes, rescues, first aid equipment, navigation, marine hazards, landing in surf, weather, emergency signaling, kayaking equipment including, trip leadership skills, clothing, packing a kayak and, time permitting, the Eskimo Roll.

Two locations are being considered: Lake Eric at Sterling State Park in Monroe or Lake Michigan at Muskegon State Park. This is a camping weekend and a "pot luck" dinner will be held on Saturday night. The course is limited to 16 participants and the cost is \$125.00 with own gear, \$165.00 with Black Parrot Paddling Gear, plus the State Park entry fee. (I forgot to add the cost for camping in last month's article). You will need a sea sayak (no river kayaks) or you can rent a kayak from Ron. Kayaks must be over 14' or more with adequate flotation, and you must have a spray skirt, life jacket, paddle, pump and paddle float. A wet suit and nose plugs are highly recommended. If you don't have a wet suit you can rent one from Ron for \$25. People renting boats and gear from Ron will have priority for wet suit rentals. Sign up at the April meeting. Full payment is required to hold a spot. Ron will be doing a Kayaking Program at the June meeting. Call Sharon Broderick to register at (248) 960-2095.

Mobican River Weekend

Hiking / Waterfulls / Canoeing / Kayaking / Hat Tubs

Come join us May 5-7, 2000 for a fun-packed weekend of hiking and your choice of canoeing or kayaking the Mohican River in Loudonville, Ohio, southwest of Akron. The drive is about 4 hours from Detroit. The Mohican River is located primarily in Ohio's Glaciated Appalathian Plateau. One of the highlights of the area is the impressive Clearfork Gorge, a 150-200 foot cut into the hilly landscape. We will also see some waterfalls along our hiking trail. Our lodging is in cabins at the Mohican Canoe Livery and Fun Center. These cabins have showers and also hot tubs on the back decks that overlook a man-made lake. We'll possibly have a potluck or picnic on Sunday. Cost of the trip is \$68 for 2 nights' lodging, \$16 for canoeing (per person) or \$18 kayaking. I have 24 spots available, and as always, first pay, first go. The cabin portion of this trip must be paid in full by the April meeting (The last day I can cancel cabins with no penalty). 
About The Ray
