





#### Apple Bread Pudding With Maple Cream

3 apples 2 fbsp butter 1/4 cup brandy 1 1/2 tsp cinnamon 1/4 tsp each of allspice, ginger, nutmeg, ground clove 4- seand litead 1 tbsp sugar

Slice apples thinly. Melt butter over median heat. Add all of about except bread and sugar. Cook apples until tender. Slice bread 1/4 inch thick and t inch square.

Butter an eight inch deep casserale state and sprinkle with the 1 that sugar.
Alternate layers of cooked apples and bread,

3 egg yolks 2 whole eggs 1-1/4 cup whole milk (or cream)

3/4 cup sugar 1-1/2 tsp vanilla

Mix all of the above together and then pour dyer top of bread and apples.

1/4 cup flour 1/4 cup softened butter

3 tosp sugar 1 tosp cinnamon

Mix all of above using a fork and then crumble by hand over top of pudding.


Preheat over to 350 degrees. Place casserole dish in a shallow reasting pan filled with one inch of hot water. Place the whole shebang in oven for 1-1/4 hours.

1-1/2 cups maple syrup 1/4 cup brandy

1 cup warmed heavy cream

Over medium light heat, cook the syrup and brandy uncovered until it starts to darken. Then whisk in the warmed cream. DO NOT BO\$L. Pour maple cream over pudding and enjoy this guilt free dessert!

#### Enjoy Michigan Winters BACKPACKING

Winter backpacking skill is not just for winters, it is also a useful back-up for the unexpected cold days in early spring and late fall.

This course will teach you the "ins-and-outs" of cold weather backpacking. We'll teach you how to stay warm, how to keep your energy level up when skiing, or snow shoeing. We'll also teach you how to build a snow shelter, just in case something does go horribly wrong on that easy "3-hour ski trip".

You can also use these skills while camping glaciers, or snowy peaks at the Rockies.

The first class will be on December 13th, and the remaining classes held on all five Wednesdays in January (2001). The practicals will be on the weekends of Jan. 20th, and Feb. 3, 2001. The cost is \$75.00. All indoor classes will be held at Benchmark in Farmington.

The course is open to the graduates of the Backpacking Course. The course is the prerequisite for the Winter Survival class, usually held in February. Although a first Aid certification is not required, it is recommended for outings.
