
### SOLAR's baggers


- Have you ever wanted to try rock climbing?



### SOLAR Memorial Weekend Rafting Trip

Jim Giffix is planning a SOLAR Rafting trip on the New River in <u>West Virginia</u> for the Memorial Day Weekend, May 24-27, 2002. This will be a unique trip and a first, considering all the options. This will be an excellent adventure for people age 6-77, who are either new to solar, "old-timers" looking for something new, or families with <u>Kids</u>, looking for a fun safe trip. This trip will have the options of one of three experiences. You will choose one. The first is the Traditional Lower New River, the "Grand Canyon of the East" and will be for people age 15 and up. This is the trip Solar has sponsored for many years. The second trip will be the Kid-Friendly trip on the Upper New River. This section is suitable for beginners, kids and those wanting a more laid-back adventure. This section is rated Class I and II. There is NO chance of the boat tipping or anyone being knocked overboard. Minimum age is 6. The third trip is a new one. It is called "Team Extreme" as it is an intense and aggressive whitewater experience. It is also on the Lower New River. They use small rafts for 4 or 5 people (as opposed to 7 or 8) per raft. They provide intense instructional orientation and they encourage you to be in top physical shape. They say this is similar to the Galley in the fall, but warmer. Minimum age is 18.

All three trips will go on the same day, May 26, 2001 (Sunday). Once again we will be using ACE Adventures Company. Every raft will have a trained guide. The cost will cover rafting and all three meals that day, and camping FOR ALL TERES NIGHTS, on their grounds. The cost will range from \$85 for kids, \$160 for adults and \$200 for the "Extreme" experience (which can only be hooked in groups of 4 or 5).



The professor in charge is accepting volunteers for one-week sessions. The cost is around \$650 all-inclusive at the archaeologists' field camp (airfare not included).

### 2002 Solar Archaeology Field School

In 2002, SOLAR will continue its foray into the exciting world of archaeological field work by returning to the Crawford Lake, Ontario area for digs at the Metate Iroquois village (circa 1450) under the supervision of archaeologist and author Dr. Bill Finlayson.

WITO IS ELIGIBLE: There are 15 spots on each dig. SOLAR membership is required. Children over 8 are welcome at a reduced cost. No experience is necessary.

<u>LOCATION</u>: We will camp at Rattlesnake Provincial Park and visit a reconstructed Iroquois village at Crawford Lake Conservation Area. We will also participate in a dig on private land nearby

COST: Last year, the program was \$160 US plus \$10 Canadian for camping (\$110 for children, plus camping). I am waiting for confirmation from Dr. Finlayson regarding this year's price. This program cost covers two days of lectures, demonstrations, tours, and digging, as well as two sandwich lunches and a barbecue steak dinner on Saturday night. Please note that the SOLAR 'no refund' policy with he <u>strictly enforced</u> this year.

DATES, June 15-16-on-- July 20-21

### TENTATIVE SCHEDULE:

Friday night - Drive to campground (-4 hours from suburban Detroit)

Saturday, 8 a.m. - Dr. Finlayson picks as up from the campground.

Saturday morning – Visit the field lab for a slide show and lecture about how, when, and by whom the land was occupied, with hands-on examination of different types of artifacts we can expect to find, then have lunch at the field lab.

Saturday afternoon. At the Metate site, learn the basics of how to dig, grab a trowel, and unearth burnt animal and fish bones, stone flakes, stone tools, charcoal, burnt corn, and pottery. If you're very lucky, find arrowheads, stone knives, buttons, pendants, stone pipes, trade beads or copper.

Saturday night – Return with our treasures to the field lab for a delicious barbecue steak dinner. After dinner, go to the reconstructed village at Crawford Lake for a private, behind-the-scenes tour of an authentic I oquois village with longhouses, fortified walls, ossuary (place for the bones of the dead) and gardens.

Sunday morning More digging at the Metate site.

Sunday afternoon - Return to the field lab to wash, sort, and identify our finds. Dismissed about 3 p.m.


