JUNE PROGRAM- "MICHIGAN IS COUGAR COUNTRY"

Will be presented by: Dennis Fijalkowski, Executive Director of the Michigan Wildlife Conservancy

The Michigan Wildlife Conservancy has rediscovered the cougar (<u>Puma conco.or</u>) in Michigan. In 2001, this non-profit organization proved the existence of the big cat in the Upper Peninsula with a variety of evidence including tracks, cougar-killed deer, and DNA from scats (droppings).

The Conservancy recently proved with DNA and other evidence that congars exist in the Lower Peninsula counties of Emmet, Presque Isle, Alcona and Roscorrmon. They are currently tracking cats in a number of other Lower Peninsula counties including Benzie and Leclanar. Two congars were actually observed during the fieldwork in Benzie and Roscorrmon Counties.

The presentation of this scientific information has not yet persuaded the Michigan Department of Natural Resources to fully acknowledge and protect Michigan's cougar; however, the Conservancy's discovery lends credibility to the large number of sightings of congars in Michigan throughout the 26th century.

Mr. Fijalkowski will present the findings described above, how the Cougar needs to be preserved in MI and what you can do to help this effort. He will also answer questions about Michigan cougars after his presentation.

Dennis Fijalkowski has graduate degrees in both Wildlife Ecology and Forestry. He has worked his entire career in the private sector, with more than five years at the Michigan United Conservation Clubs. For two years Fijalkowski was a private environmental consultant, Fis primary client being the Michigan Senate. In 1982 he co-founded the Michigan Wildlife Habitat Foundation and has been the Executive Director since. He also co-founded the Michigan Chapter of The Wildlife Secrety and the Michigan Wild Turkey Federation. Fijalkowski is active in farmland and open space preservation and moving society towards environmental sustain ability.


