glaciers of the frozen continent; including rare photos of the field excavation of the famous continental drift synapsid reptile *Lystrosaurus* and the skeleton of *Cryolephosaurus*, a ferocious Early Jurassic dinosaur collected by Wayne State University graduate Dr William Hammer 200 miles from the South Pole!
