SIMIEN MOUNTAINS NATIONAL PARK, ETHIOPIA

Lammergeyers floated effortlessly on the thermals above Ethiopia's Simien Mountains. Aside from an occasional screech from these huge vultures, the quiet of the Simien Mountains National Park intensified the extraordinary panoramas of one of Africa's most breathtaking geological sights. In a country where people are seemingly everywhere and the sight of a carload of faranji (foreigners) causes mass



pandemonium and requests for birr (the local currency), the remoteness and silence of the place added to its enchanting quality.



The overland journey from Debark through numerous small towns and majestic landscapes barely prepared me for the dramatic landscape of the park itself. Skirting the massive valleys and outcroppings of rocks resembling mountains of the moon, the circuitous, rocky, unpaved roads

took us slowly upward to about 3,000m. The trip allowed for kaleidoscopic views of the wild landscape and for the occasional flat tire. Small inconveniences like that gave me the opportunity to experience the area even better as I was able to walk part of the way to the destination.





Although relatively unknown in the U.S, the Simien

Mountain range is one of Africa's largest and boasts at least

a dozen peaks topping the 4,000m mark.

This fabulous region provides homes to exotic flora and fauna—many of which are endemic to Ethiopia. Three of Ethiopia's endemic mammals inhabit the Simiens: the gelada baboon, the

Walia ibex, and the Ethiopian wolf. Only the gelada baboons cooperated in making themselves available for photos. They're protected within this UNESCO site and are so comfortable around people, close up photos are the norm rather than the exception.

Thick-billed ravens and hadada ibis also inhabit the park along with about 50 other species of birds including the impressive lammergeyers with their 10 foot wingspan.

The landscape is studded with the beautiful and endemic Abyssinian wild rose as well as a wide variety of plants such as wild iris, mint, everlasting, lavender, thyme, Lady's Mantle, and flat top acacia trees.

A few of the local Amharic villagers met up with our group toward the end of our road trip through this magical place offering to sell us a variety of handmade items—hats were the particular specialty. For 30 birr (or USD3) I should



have bought several. As it is, you may see me on the trail one day in my native Amharic headgear.

Although I didn't get in much trekking on this trip (with or without the hat), trekking this off-the-map landscape remains the best way to explore the area. However, I was on a tour with a varied itinerary and a specific time schedule, so the road trip in a good 4x4 allowed me to get a good feel for the scenery and the wildlife of the Simiens. A return trip with time to hike in this awe-inspiring place feels like a good plan to me.

A group of SOLAR people have been devoting considerable time this winter to building West Greenland Kayaks Replicas. This endeavor was lead by Chuck Smith who rented a basement workshop and supplied machinery. Here is a pictorial montage of the progress made, there are 16 boats under construction.

Design Rules:


- Maximum of three colors
