#### A New Online Calendar for SOLAR

Editor's Note: This article varies somewhat from the article in the print version of the Ray. SOLAR leadership is still learning about Meetup.com and the tools it offers, and there have been some changes to how we are utilizing Meetup.com since the April Ray print deadline. Those changes are reflected in this article. Thank you for your patience as we continue to learn about the features of Meetup.com for our membership!

When you open your web browser and go to the SOLAR website to view our calendar of events, you're using a

custom calendar application written by previous SOLAR webmasters. The information in the calendar i s maintained by Steering Committee members. Not only does it drive the online calendar, it also plays a key role in generating printed t h e calendar that gets handed out at every monthly

meeting. The calendar is clearly a vital part of the club. It has served us well for several years. However, computer and internet technology continue to move forward at breakneck speeds. As things have evolved, our calendar has lost some of its original shine.

We examined what it would take to modify or rewrite the SOLAR website calendar and also examined multiple webbased calendar systems offered by other providers. After careful consideration, we have decided to give the Meetup.com calendar a test run as the replacement for the SOLAR calendar.

#### About Meetup.com

Meetup.com is an online social networking site designed to help groups schedule face-to-face gatherings, and to help users of the site find Meetup groups that suit their interests. The site boasts 6 million users, 68,000 groups, and 180,000 monthly events, which they call "meetups".

Joining Meetup.com is free. You can find the SOLAR Meetup calendar at www.meetup.com/SOLAR-Outdoors/ calendar/. You'll also find a link to the fully featured Meetup.com

calendar when you visit the <a href="www.solaroutdoors.org/Calendar/">www.solaroutdoors.org/Calendar/</a> calendar page. You need to be a current member of SOLAR in order to join the SOLAR Outdoors Meetup group. Your request to join the Meetup group will be processed by SOLAR's membership chairperson.

#### Meetup Terminology

Every event, whether it is a class, activity, meeting, or "other" is called a Meetup. Those of us who manage the SOLAR Meetup group are called organizers and assistant organizers. Event hosts are put in charge of individual Meetups.

#### **New Features**

Here are some features the Meetup.com calendar offers that we haven't had with the old calendar:

RSVP tracking. SOLAR members will be able to see who and how many fellow SOLARites are planning to attend the event. They will also know when an event is full.


<u>Detailed event information</u>. Each event entry on the calendar contains a description as well as information about where the event will take place, who's leading it, and any costs associated.

<u>Google maps</u>. Events have a link that uses Google Maps to show you where the event is located and can give you turn by turn driving directions.

<u>Ideas</u>. Want to host a Meetup or suggest an idea for an activity or class? Click

the ideas link along the top of the Meetup page and you can post your idea for others to see. Meetup.com will allow other SOLAR members to vote on whether they like or dislike the idea. Remember, someone has to step up to actually lead it. If someone does want to lead the event, that person should contact the education or activity chairperson, who can create an event. This is a great way to get a weekend hike, bike, paddle, or other outdoor activity onto the SOLAR calendar for others to see and join!

Mobile phone support. Do you have a smartphone or iPod Touch? You can access a

version of the Meetup site optimized for mobile devices. Go to <a href="http://m.meetup.com/">http://m.meetup.com/</a>, log in, and then proceed to the SOLAR Meetup group to view the calendar, RSVP to events, etc.

#### How We Will be Using Meetup

The same procedure will be followed in order to have an activity or class added to the calendar. Please contact the Activities or Education Chairs if you have any questions. The Chairperson will then add the event to the Meetup calendar. They will then assign an Event Host. The Event Host will be able to fill in any information they wish about the event. This will make it easier for those members that are unable to attend the monthly meeting to get information they need to decide if this event is something they would be interested in. Meetup also gives members the ability to discuss items that might be important to that event, like carpooling, meals (SOLAR potlucks), or sharing of rooms or campsites. We hope that Meetup will make it easier for the Activity Coordinators and Class Instructors to manage their events.

#### What is Not Changing

SOLAR is not becoming a Meetup Group. We will continue to have our monthly meetings where members can learn about and sign up for activities and classes.

The calendar at <a href="www.solaroutdoors.org">www.solaroutdoors.org</a> isn't going away. It will be modified to access the SOLAR event information at Meetup.com and present it in a format similar to what we've been using in recent years. If you're comfortable with using this format, you can continue to do so. We also intend to use the SOLAR website to generate the printed calendars handed out at meetings.

SOLAR's Yahoo! Group will continue to be used for communication among SOLAR members. At this time, we will not be using the message board functions of Meetup, and instead will continue using the SOLAR Yahoo! Group.

Keep in mind that the SOLAR Meetup calendar is a trial. If it's well liked, we plan to make the changeover permanent by September. If it turns out to be a flop, we'll revert to using the SOLAR website calendar.

We're still new to Meetup.com and the assistant organizers are learning as we go. We are working on ironing out all the kinks. Our Webmaster still has to get the solaroutdoors.org calendar modified to access the event information stored at Meetup.com. Your patience during the transition will be greatly appreciated.

The class fee is \$45, which includes a book, maps, handouts and overnight accommodations at Burns Cabin for the practical. Students are responsible for their meals and state park permits.

#### Intermediate Backpacking Class

Have you taken the basic backpacking class? Are you looking to put your new-found skills to the test, but need a little more guidance? Are you ready for your next big adventure in backpacking? Then this class is for you!

Class will be held on Thursday, April 29<sup>th</sup> from 7:00—9:00 p.m. at the:

Royal Oak Senior Community Center 3500 Marais Royal Oak, MI 48073

The Community Center is located just north of 13 Mile Road between Crooks Road and Main Street.

You and your fellow students will plan your own backpacking trip, from start to finish. Class will start out with a 2 hour lecture on trip planning. After that, where, when and how often we meet is up to you. The cost is a mere \$10 to cover materials and handouts. This class will be limited to 12 students.

The only rule is that the trip must be within a 12 hour drive of the Detroit area. Learn to pick the area to backpack, when to go, who to go with, how to obtain permits, local regulations, climate, trail conditions, crowds, trail difficulty, hiking speeds, take training/conditioning hikes, etc. The final practical can be a weekend, long weekend or a week; it is all up to you.

Permit requests are


processed starting on April 15<sup>th</sup>. I do not anticipate having an approved permit before late April.

Indiana Dunes State Park is surrounded by Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore, which includes 15,000 acres of hiking trails, sand dunes and beaches.

### Caesar Creek State Park Little Miami State Park and River

July 2 - 5, 2010

Come join us as we celebrate the July 4th holiday. This kid- and dog-friendly outing will be close to home; only about a 4 hour drive, just south of Dayton, Ohio.

Caesar Creek State Park is highlighted by clear blue waters, scattered woodlands, meadows and steep ravines. The park offers some of the finest outdoor recreation in southwest Ohio, including boating, hiking, camping and fishing. There are 43 miles of hiking trails, 8.5 miles of mountain biking trails, a lake with a 1,300 foot beach, and fossil hunting. Nearby is the Little Miami paved bike trail system with over 150 miles of trails. There is also a bike rental shop, ice cream store and winery nearby. We are going to canoe or kayak the Little Miami River on Monday and have a traditional potluck dinner on Saturday night.

We will be camping at the Wellman Group Camp within the park. We will have the entire camp to ourselves. There are flush toilets, a picnic shelter and showers nearby (8 miles) at the main campground. There is also a huge lawn for playing croquet or bocce ball. Weather permitting, there will be a nightly campfire. There may be ice cream included if we have enough money.

Naturally, animals that have shown aggressive behavior are not welcome. We want to keep things fun for both people and pets, and worrying about the safety of either

is not fun.

As pet owners, it is also our responsibility to remain aware of other people's reactions to our pets. Not all people or all SOLARites like animals. So, try to keep pets in an area where other participants can avoid encountering them if they choose. This will help avoid conflicts and keep things enjoyable for all, people and pets.

Finally, poop happens! Please clean up after your pet. In a building or on the trail, let's keep it a clean world.

#### A Word from the President: 2009-2010 Steering Committee Accomplishments

As we near the end of this term, I would like to acknowledge this year's talented <a href="Steering Committee members">Steering Committee members</a> for all their hard work over the past 10 months, and at the same time, communicate to our members what we've been up to during that time. The Steering Committee's work is not always visible to the membership, so I want to take this opportunity to share some of our accomplishments with our members.

This year, we began renting a climate-controlled storage unit near Colony Hall for storing <u>SOLAR's equipment</u>. Previously, all equipment was kept in the home of the Equipment Chair. In addition, a committee was established to create and manage a system for loaning equipment to our members.

Since you are reading this, I probably don't need to tell you about the great additions to the SOLAR Ray, but I'm going to anyway. Some examples are the inclusion of an index, micro-interviews of members, and the bonus articles and photos available in the <u>online version of the Ray</u>. Of course, we couldn't have a Ray without submissions from our members, so we need you to keep those coming.

Although I associate the Steering Committee with many of these accomplishments, this year we made a conscious effort to provide more opportunities for members to pitch in and get involved.
