Hike the gorgeous mountains or paddle nearby lakes and rivers. Explore the quaint village of Lake Placid. This is always a popular trip.

Make and pay for your own reservations. *September 22* to be spent at High Peaks Hostel in Lake Placid, 518-523-4951. Price is \$40 including breakfast, and will be lowered to \$30 if 6+ SOLAR members stay. No credit cards.

September 23 through Friday, September 27 (departing 9/28 a.m.) to be spent at the Adirondack Loj at Heart Lake, 518-523-3441 (8 a.m.-7 p.m.). Ask for the Mid-Week Special and let them know you are with SOLAR. Loj accommodations are in the \$400-\$450 range per person including all meals depending on room. Campsites are available for \$40 for 2 people; no meals. Access trailheads right from the Loj!

Space in the Loj is filling up quickly. Staying at High Peaks Hostel, about 20 minutes away, for the whole week is an option. The rate will be reduced for multi-day stays; kitchen access to cook your own dinner or lunch.

Backpacking Trip to Zaleski State Forest

October 18-21, 2012



Did you go on the Lake Hope Labor Day trip last year and think "I'd love to see more of these trails"? Just finish the Beginning Backpacking class and want to put your new skills to use? Or perhaps you just want to get in another weekend in the woods while the weather is great.

We're heading down to southern Ohio and its rocky trails. While the ridges top out at about 500 feet, there's a lot of elevation change as we hike up and down the hollows and among the impressive stone outcroppings of the Appalachian foothills. We'll be in beautiful second growth hardwood forests, passing by remnants of the area's iron-mining past. Total trail length is 23.5

miles. Daily mileage will be between 5.5 and 7 miles (determined by campsite location), with options for short trips on spur trails.

Depart SE Michigan Wednesday evening and camp at nearby Lake Hope State Park.
