I experienced a "north of the border" feel as I read the Ray for that month. Three events involved travel to Canada. Here are excerpts from the June 1995 Ray:

Wilderness Canoe Class: Back by popular demand, it's the SOLAR Wilderness Canoe Class. This class will cover topics needed for an extended trip, including paddling and portage techniques, canoe loading, portage knot-craft, specialized equipment, emergency repair and a host of other topics to make your trip up the river a success.

# Heavner Canoe Rental 60th Anniversary

It was a warm and welcoming celebration. Al Heavner and his nearly 97-year-old mother were the guests of honor. His mom knew about it, as she is wheelchair-bound and someone had to transport her. It was a complete surprise for Al, and he was deeply touched. There were stories galore - including one I had never heard. Apparently, Heavner's was started in 1953 (Al was 4 years old) with just 2 cloth-sided canoes. Both were picked up at Belle Isle and sold to them used. One had been used for target practice! As Al's mom said, "So we just recovered the canvas and started the business!" Lots of laughter, some tears (but happy tears), and lots and lots of memories shared. It brought to the forefront just how much Al has done for the surrounding community. He is involved in Heavner's, of course, but is also involved with No Child Left Inside, and helping handicapped children by getting them exposed to the outdoors as well.

are also two practicals associated with the class. The first will be Saturday, June 10 at Island Lake Recreation Area. The second will be an extended weekend, July 1-4, to Algonquin Provincial Park in Ontario.

5th Annual Fossil Hunt at Arkona: Join us Sunday, July 16 for this unique outing for your family or yourself. See beautiful woods, exciting waterfalls, walk down a fossil stream and swim in the Huron River in Arkona, Ontario (about 2 hours from Royal Oak). Jim Gilfix has sponsored this trip the past four years and everyone always has tons of fun; it's a day to remember! We will tour their museum, share a pot-luck lunch (about 1:30), then go for a hike which begins under their 35 foot waterfall, down the stream to the fossil fields. This is a FREE trip and open to all.

A Day on Pelee Island: Join the SOLAR club as we head off to the southernmost point in all of Canada, Pelee Island.

Plan to arrive in Leamington...at 8:30 AM on June 3 to board the ferry to the island. This is the ONLY ferry, so don't be late! Cost of the boat ride is \$10 round trip plus \$5 for a bike or \$21 for a car, neither of which are needed.

Once on the island we will be taking a tour of one of Ontario's most picturesque wineries, attend a wine seminar, and a tasting of 5 wines (\$6). Also plan on about \$7 for lunch.

We will be done at the winery around 2 PM and the ferry back is at 4 PM, so we can walk to the petting zoo, playground, trading post, pheasant farm, nature reserve (2 miles), the beach (3.5 miles) or the lighthouse (8.5 miles, you may want to rent a bike for this).

I've enjoyed learning some of our history and sharing it with you during the past year. I hope it's also been fun for you!

# Summer Fun at Nordhouse Dunes

Fourth of July Weekend July 3-7

Michigan summer at its best! Primitive camping, hiking, swimming, bicycling, exploring, sunset viewing, sun-bathing, shade-lolling — you choose how much adventure or pure relaxation you want!

Kid and dogs friendly (both must be well-behaved). Dogs must be leashed, picked up after and are prohibited from the swimming beach. Group sites are set up for non-electric tent camping with pit toilets. About a 4-hour drive from Southfield, north of Ludington and south of Manistee.

Hike the trails in the wilderness area or along the dunes all the way to Ludington State Park. Mountain bike on forest roads or on trails at Big M/Udell. Visit nearby Manistee for the Forest Festival or Ludington for the shops, elk farm, or the Sandcastle Museum. Fireworks take place at several nearby towns. Feel free to organize an add-on activity such as a paddle trip on the Pere Marquette River. We will take a couple hours to pick up plastic and trash along the beach on Saturday morning.

\$25/adult; \$15/child



We will start off paddling from Heavner Canoe Rental at Proud Lake State Recreation Area and paddle down the Huron River to Kent Lake in Island Lake State Recreation Area. This trip will take about 6 ½ hours to paddle. There is an alternate take out point at the Shore Fishing Parking lot in Kensington Metropark at about the 4-hour mark.

You need to reserve and pay for your own kayak or canoe or transport for your own boat directly with Heavner, (248) 685-2379. Tell them you are with the SOLAR/Jeff Enterkin paddle on June 9. Let them know your out take-out point.

The cost is \$40 per canoe, \$35 per kayak, and \$10 for transportation of your own boat back to Proud Lake. Children under 12 are half price; no charge for kids under 6 years old.

Things you will need to bring:

- •Dress for the Weather •Hat •Sunglasses •Bug spray
- •Food and Drink: we'll be eating somewhere on the river
- •Maybe a nice soft cushion to sit on •Super Soakers or other toys are ok if you only shoot people who don't mind!

After you have reserved your boat, sign up on Meetup or contact me directly to let me know you are coming. Guests welcome; you do not need to be a SOLAR member to join us.



# White Mountains Backpacking 7 July 20-28

We will be hiking the Appalachian Trail in the southern stretch of the Mahousuc Range in Maine, starting just south of the infamous Mahousuc Notch, crossing the New Hampshire border to hike the "Presidentials" section of the White Mountains, and finishing up by going over Mt. Washington where the world-record fastest wind gust was recorded. This is one of the more difficult sections of the AT; hikers and their gear will need to be in excellent condition. We will average 10 miles per day, totaling about 61 miles for the week.

Anticipated costs included travel permits and hut fees, campsite or hotel fees en route, and (possibly) a shuttle. There will be training hikes and a mandatory shake-down trip.

# Algonquin Wilderness Canoe Trip July 13 - 21 Organized by Phil Crookshank, Phil2425@yahoo.com

Algonquin Provincial Park – 100,000 square miles of designated paddling wilderness with diamond-sparkling water is in Ontario, Canada, northeast of Toronto, about a six hour drive from Southfield. We will be paddling lake-to-lake, camping at designated camp spots, many on islands. Sightings of moose, ducks by the hundreds, loons calling, distant wolves howling. Splendid misty sunrises, sunsets reflecting on the water, with plenty of time at day's end for a leisurely swim, supper, and campfire stories.

This trip covers 2 travel days and 7 days of rugged wilderness paddling, 5-6 hours each day, canoeing many lakes that are connected by rivers and portage trails. There are portages—some short, a couple that about 2 kilometers—on all days but one. This trip is designed for intermediate level participants, with basic paddling skills, and backcountry camping experience. We will be renting Superlight Kevlar Canoes, which weigh around 45 lbs. You will need to be able to help carry a canoe plus your pack—or convince your paddling partner to do it! Trip organizer will assign partners so each team will be fairly balanced for skill and strength. It's a strenuous trip but do-able and very rewarding!

8 people maximum. Requirements: Solar membership, passport or enhanced driver's license, backpacking and canoeing experience.

Cost: \$325, includes canoe and paddle rental, safety kit, maps, lists, permits, camp fees, rentals of equipment, 2 camp breakfasts, gear list, and pre-trip meeting with detailed instructions of "How To." Meals going and coming and ride share costs (approx. \$60/person), are not included. Each participant will provide one dinner for the group. Deposits required: \$175 by June 6; last \$150 by July 2. Checks must be made out to: Philip Crookshank. Email/call for address.


