Education Carol McCririe

- Beginning Backpacking Workshop finished up with the final practical at Waterloo Recreation area the 1st weekend in May. Krisanne will be recognizing the students at the general meeting on the 30th.
- The backcountry cooking workshop on April 27th was a success. We had 11 participants and got some great feedback. Krisanne will give a shout out to these participants also.
- Eric Braun, along with Jeff McWilliams are teaching a bike cleaning and tuning basics workshop on May 20th, with a rain date of May 21st. The workshop will be hosted at Eric's home and may include a post-instructional bike ride. I believe that the workshop is full. Jeff reported it went well with 5 participants. Eric presented the material well and everyone had a good time cleaning their bikes. Eric and Jeff shared their bike repair stands and other brought their own which would limit the number of participants in a workshop like this.
- Eric has also expressed some interest in hosting a Mountain biking workshop. I have not gotten any details yet; more to follow.
- Matt Dalton has expressed an interest in teaching an intro to kayaking workshop. I
 have reached out via email to determine what he is thinking about in terms of timing and
 costs. To date, I have not heard back from him. I sent him another email this month.
- I met someone at the QAS who expressed a willingness to teach water safety. I am not sure how closely this would parallel a kayak workshop but will be following up with her also.
- Workshops that we have taught in the past Intermediate BP and Land Navigation these are both tentative at this point and I will try to have more info in June.
- I will be out of town through May 31st and will miss both the SC meeting and the general meeting. Krisanne will be filling in for me at the general meeting.

Equipment Chair Jeff McWilliams

- Phil said he was going to mail me his key/passcode and whatever else is in his personal
 possession that needs to be turned over. The rest should be in the storage unit. So far, I haven't
 received anything.
- While serving as a volunteer for the Beginner Backpacking workshop at the Brighton weekend, one of the participants returned one of our sleeping pads saying it leaked. It was marked "SP-309"
- I took it home and inspected it. There was a 3" long gash in the stuff sack. There were also two pinhole leaks in the sleeping pad found by submerging the inflated pad in a tub full of water.
- The gash in the stuff sack has been repaired with tenacious tape. The pinhole leaks were repaired with tenacious tape and SeamGrip adhesive.
- It's my opinion that the gash in the stuff sack was NOT normal wear & tear, but it's unclear to me when the damage occurred.
- At the same weekend, participants were setting up tents and two of the club tents had poles with shock-cord that was so stretched that the poles would not properly "snap" into shape to support the tent. These were Big Agnes tents but I did not write down exactly which ones.

- I was able to make "field repairs" on both the tents by trimming the length of the shock cord and
 putting the pole assemblies back together, but the poles need new shock-cord. I have ordered
 some replacement from Dutchware Gear because it seemed a lot more affordable than the
 replacement shock cord kits sold by Big Agnes.
- It's my opinion that this is probably normal wear and tear. Shock cord can get stretched, particularly if users aren't careful with how they take apart the pole assemblies.
- My plan for June is to take home all the Big Agnes tents and inspect the pole assemblies and replace shock-cord as necessary.
- Krisanne said that we're short on usable sleeping pads for the workshop, as the Ridgerest CCF pads are not comfortable when used alone, and the self-inflating Thermarest pads are too bulky. We talked about the possibility of purchasing 1 or 2 new sleeping pads.
- REI will have their anniversary sale from May 19 May 29 and they will have 30% off of "REI Branded Backpacking Gear". It may be worth looking at their REI Helix insulated inflatable pads or another brand/model.
- During the Beginner Backpacking practical weekend on the Waterloo Pinckney trail, there was
 rain in the forecast for Sunday morning so each team was issued a tarp. I watched the teams set
 up their tarps in Saturday evening, and I was surprised by the fact that no club tarps come with
 stakes.
- As a long time backpacker, I take stakes for granted because I have a bin of various stakes that I swap between my different shelters depending on my needs. But I wouldn't expect a bunch of newbie backpackers to have a stash of extra tent stakes lying around to use with a borrowed tarp, and it seems weird to expect them to purchase stakes. (Cordage to make their own guylines seems relatively cheap).
- MSR brand "Ground Hog" stakes are ridiculously priced at \$4.89 per stake at Campsaver, and \$4.95 per stake at REI. This is ridiculous. I'd like to look for some generic "knock off" of the Groundhog "Y" stakes. The other cheaper stakes on REI's website are plastic or steel trash.
- Discussion about budget and age of some of the equipment. \$100 for repairs, \$100 for new equipment

 Club (MAC) group to share about our events/meeting. Bob to share details with Jim about how to

- do some of these things. Stacie suggested emailing the calendar information like from the meeting.
- Bev asked about the live feed for Facebook at meetings. Bob is covering the May meeting. They
 are still working on who can add or do the live stream for Facebook. Bob lost his access and will
 contact Jennifer Tislerics to get added back on for the May meeting.
- Bev is not going to be at the May meeting or the June 10th picnic.
- Bev was talking with Mike about the van concept for an outdoor meeting.
- Bev asked: If I have an idea of a speaker, do I have to present it to the steering committee or can I just schedule speaker. Bev can just schedule presentations.
- Krisanne asked that Bev give her to the speakers for meetings so she can add them as soon as possible.

Public Relations Jim Kadlubowski

- Bob share Jim is responsible for the Welcome board, which Bob will give to Jim and business cards, which are getting low that, and more will need to be ordered.
- Budget for this year: \$50 for supplies, \$30 for table fees for Quiet Adventure Symposium
- Bob and Jim to get together to talk more about public relations responsibilities.

Dana will send a welcome letter, which explains how to join Meetup where she will coordinate their dues. It takes time for it to process from our website. Bob to write some a statement about reconciling their dues between the two systems.
- Mike asked about if we would have a formal handoff meeting or have each individual person coordinate the exchange of the information. In the past, a long time ago it was given to the Historian to organize by year. Should we have a digital information storage place like for the taxes, backup equipment person for access to the equipment storage unit.
